Code of Conduct

- This Code of Conduct will address the conduct of players, coaches, parents, and administrators who participate in the Franklin Lacrosse Club (FLC). FLC will charge your payment method on file for \$350 in March. You will not be able to turn in any unsold cards or transition to another fundraising option.
